

Brown Gets Land

N. Kingstown Tract Given To University

Brown University yesterday received a gift of 31 acres of land lying between Tower Hill Road and the Pettaquamscutt River in North Kingstown from Elmer G. MacDowell, university trustee and 1914 graduate.

The land lies near 104 acres given the university last year by Mr. MacDowell who lives in Saunderson and is a president of Aluminium Union, Ltd., and International Aluminium Co., Ltd., and a director of four other aluminum firms.

The university said the land would be used jointly for the time being for field trips of students under Prof. J. Louis Giddings Jr., director of the Haffenreffer Museum of the American Indian in Bristol, and the botany department.

Eventually, however, the univer-

sity hopes to be able to sell the land, it said.
