Dr. Robert D. Calkins, Brookings president, announced that the Ford Foundation has made a grant of \$6,200,000 to the institution for a center for advanced study. He said the re-mainder of the money for a 13-million-dollar expansion program will be sought from other foundations and individuals.

He said the Ford Foundation grant recognized "the need for national center where the full intellectual resources of the American people might brought to bear more effectively on national and international problems.'
